## 1.5 MILLION WORKERS

The textiles ecosystem, encompassing Textiles, Clothing, Leather, and Footwear (TCLF) industries, is critical to Europe's economic landscape but faces significant challenges.

#### AGEING WORKFORCE

- $\rightarrow$  42% employees above 50 years old (2022)
- $\rightarrow$  difficulty in attracting young workers

#### **GREEN & DIGITAL SKILLS GAP**

- → 55% of companies report difficulties filling ICT vacancies
- ightarrow 40% of companies report green skills gap

#### **GENDER DISPARITY**

- $\rightarrow$  workforce dominated by women
- ightarrow but not in management or senior positions

## European Pact for Skills

November 2020

Initiated by the European Commission, it is one of the flagship actions of the European Skills Agenda. This initiative encourages a collaborative approach involving <u>companies</u>, <u>educational institutions</u>, and <u>government bodies</u> to invest in the lifelong learning of the European workforce.

The Pact is supporting <u>14 industrial ecosystems</u> through their green and digital transitions.
